Tips & Tricks for UBI - Drill to Details in GA Summary BBA.

• Many standard reports in Discoverer map directly to a standard report in UBI. Standard reports in Discoverer now include information on the corresponding module and tab in UBI for quick and easy access.

• The BBA by Expenditure Type report is located in the GA_Summary_BBA module in UBI, and can be viewed by selecting the same parameters as in the Discoverer version of the report. In order to see information at the Expenditure Type level, you must expand the collapsed Award and Org columns.

• The Drill to Details feature in the GA_Summary_BBA module allows you to quickly view transaction details from a BBA report. Instructions are included in the presentation handout and on the UBI Community: <u>Drill to</u> <u>Details in the GA: Summary BBA Module</u>.

• The "Mail bookmark as link" feature of UBI allows you to quickly send your current selections to another UBI user, allowing them to create a bookmark. Details are included in the presentation handout and in the <u>Intro to</u> <u>UBI Manual</u> on the UBI Community.
